<u>5-11-08</u> A resolution from the City of Kingston, dated April 2, 2008, concerning ZENN Automobiles on Ontario Roads and requesting the Province of Ontario to give approval for the ZENN car and other electric automobiles to be used on Ontario roads. The City is also requesting that every Province and Territory in Canada give approval for the ZENN car and other electric automobiles to be sold and used across Canada as soon as possible.

<u>#8:</u> Gillis/Arnold: That we support the resolution from the City of Kingston, to request the Province of Ontario to give approval for the ZENN car and other electric automobiles to be used on Ontario roads.

<u>5-13-08</u> A resolution from the Township of Tiny, dated April 16, 2008, requesting support of the resolution from Garfield Dunlop, MPP of Simcoe North, to recognize that the year 2015 will mark the 400th anniversary of the coming of the French explorer, founder and Father of Canada, Samuel de Champlain to Ontario. The site of de Champlaine's arrival on August 1, 1615 at the Huron Village of Toanche in what is today the Township of Tiny, near the Town of Penetanquishene, was marked by a cross and that site still exists to this day.

# Correspondence to Receive and File

<u>5-1-08</u> A letter from the Ministry of Finance, dated March 31, 2008, advising that the Ontario Government introduced Bill 35, the proposed Investing in Ontario Act, 2008 and that the County of Lambton would receive a capital grant from the Province if the Bill is enacted and the Provinces' 2007-08 surplus exceeds \$800 million. The County of Lambton would have flexibility and discretion to spend any grant provided on its capital priorities. The accountability provisions associated with these grants would require reporting back to the Province on how the funds were used, allowing for independent audit, and providing for recovery of the funds should they not be used for capital purposes. Also attached are details on how any 2007-08 surpluses would be allocated to Municipalities throughout Ontario to help address capital needs.

<u>5-3-08</u> A Member Communication from the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (A.M.O.), dated April 16, 2008, providing an update to Members on the March 2008 Board Meeting. Highlights of the meeting were as follows:

- a) A.M.O. Response to Proposed Changes to the Ontario Building Code;
- b) Proposed A.M.O. Economic Development Task Force;
- c) Federal and Provincial Infrastructure Funding;
- d) Provincial Budget; and,
- e) Waste Electronics and Electrical Equipment Plan.

- <u>5-5-08</u> A letter from the Ministry of Public Infrastructure Renewal, dated March 28, 2008, informing that as part of the government's strategy commitment to supporting municipal infrastructure priorities announced in the 2007 Ontario Economic Outlook and Fiscal Review, the Ministry is advising that the County of Lambton has been authorized to receive a one-time grant of \$1,500,000.00, to be used for the London Line Rehabilitation Project.
- <u>5-6-08</u> An email from Mr. Tom Hamilton, dated February 15, 2008, advising that he, along with other Lambton residents, are concerned with the idea of the west bound portion of Highway 402 within the City Sarnia becoming four lanes, with two of those designated so that at heavy/slow bridge-crossing times, trucks can creep forward spewing unwelcome exhausts into the Sarnia atmosphere. Several individuals and groups have advocated for a holding area to the east of Sarnia where trucks could be held until proceeding at a reasonable speed to the bridge. Mr. Hamilton is hoping that local Councils will reconsider their support for an increase from two (2) to four (4) lanes along the westerly portion of Highway 402.
- <u>5-7-08</u> An article from Solid Waste & Recycling, dated February 23, 2008, titled "Ontario Approves Diversion Plan for HHW". The article states that Ontario Environment Minister John Gerretsen has approved a new program that aims to double the amount of household hazardous waste (HHW) and special waste that Ontario diverts from landfills and the environment over the next five (5) years. The government's news release states that the program, developed under the auspices of Waste Diversion Ontario (WDO), will help Ontarians reduce, reuse, recycle and responsibly dispose of common household products such as paints, solvents, batteries and oil filters that can often end up being poured down the drain or thrown out with regular garbage.
- <u>5-8-08</u> A Media Release from Clean Harbors Environmental Services, dated March 3, 2008, advising that they have launched a user-friendly website dedicated to providing factual, up-to-date information about its Lambton hazardous waste management facility. The new website (www.cleanharbors.com/lambton) will help visitors better understand Clean Harbors' activities and management at the Lambton facility, and underscores the company's commitment to maintaining transparent, effective and balanced communications with all of its interest groups.
- <u>5-9-08</u> An email from Barbara Burgess, Economic Development Consultant, Ministry of Agriculture Food and Rural Affairs, dated April 16, 2008, advising that Ontario is helping Municipalities "green" their buildings through a grant process designed to cut both energy costs and environmental impacts. Premier Dalton McGuinty announced that Municipalities can apply for the grant to cover up to twenty-five percent (25%) of retrofit costs, up to a maximum of \$100,000.00. The application deadline is May 23, 2008.

- A new project be created as part of the 2008 Capital Program to reconstruct that section of County Road 12 (Townsend Line) from County Road 7 (Lakeshore Road) to the west limits of the Town of Forest at an estimated cost of \$1,320,000.
