

MINUTES

INFRASTRUCTURE & DEVELOPMENT SERVICES DIVISION

Correspondence

PW 12-1-09 A letter from Mort White, received October 8, 2009, who is concerned about the Clean Harbor Hazardous Waste Drop-off Days. Mr. White feels that there should be more days, as there tends to be long line-ups and people are waiting too long. Suggestions include lengthening the time of the drop-off days, and/or doubling the lanes at the drop-off with a spot where vehicles can unload multiple pails which will keep cars moving.

7-8 #1: Arnold/Perry: That staff prepare a report to facilitate ways in which the Household Hazardous Waste program can be improved.

PW 12-2-09 A letter from McCormick Rankin Corporation, dated October 9, 2009, advising that the Ministry of Transportation has initiated a Class Environmental Assessment and detail design for improvements to Highway 40 within the City of Sarnia and the Township of St. Clair. The purpose of the study is to review and develop strategies for the rehabilitation of Highway 40 within the study limits (Part A - from Rokeby Line, northerly for 8.2 kilometres to Churchill Line) and the intersection improvements at Highway 40 / Indian Road (Part B). McCormick Rankin is seeking the County's input on the environmental (natural, socio-economic or cultural) features in the study area and asking the County to identify issues and available background information.

- 9-12 **#2:** Bradley/Foubister: That the Ministry of Transportation move expeditiously with the Environmental Assessment on the twinning of Highway 40 from Highway 402 into Chemical Valley, and also consider splitting the Environmental Assessment north and south from Indian Road. The review should also include consideration of the issues surrounding Scott Road. The motion should also be circulated to the two (2) area MPPs.

Correspondence to Receive and File

PW 12-3-09 A letter from M.H. Kaldeway, received October 19, 2009, advising that trucks should be allowed on Lakeshore Road and that this is not a safety issue. Mr. Kaldeway feels that sending the trucks the long way around and through the built up area of Forest will only add to the pollution. He is also concerned that this will affect businesses in the County.

PD 12-9-09 A memorandum from the Township of Wainfleet, dated October 15, 2009, advising that the Ministry of Natural Resources has proposed to designate a significant portion of land in Wainfleet as Provincially Significant Wetlands (SW). The Township of Wainfleet is requesting consideration and support of its resolution to strongly object to the wetland mapping proposed for the Township of Wainfleet by the Ministry of Natural Resources.

PD 12-10-09 A memorandum from The Corporation of the County of Perth, received October 30, 2009, requesting support of its resolution to request the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) to provide additional, proactive reporting to Municipalities to disclose such pending assessment changes in the future, to process the outstanding building permits to ensure that no assessment revenue is lost, that new permits be processed in a timely manner and that the Ministry of Finance be asked to reconcile the 2009 IMPF and to adjust the 2010 OMPF calculations to their proper values.

32-33 **#6:** Minielly/Arnold:

- a) That a 60 km/hr speed limit zone be established on County Road 21 (Oil Heritage Road/Lambton Line) from a point 104 metres north of County Road 15 (Dawn Mills Road) to a point 92 metres west of Lambton Line.
- b) That transitional 70 km/hr speed limit zones be established on County Road 21 (Oil Heritage Road/Lambton Line) from a point 104 metres north of County Road 15 (Dawn Mills road) north for a distance of 500 metres, and from a point 92 metres west of Lambton Line west for a distance of 500 metres.

34-41 **#7:** Burns/Gillis: That we lift from the table motion #5 of the Committee A.M. minutes dated October 21, 2009 regarding the Restriction of Trucks on County Roads.

PW 12-13-09 A letter from the Lambton Federation of Agriculture (LFA), dated November 10, 2009, advising that it believes by having roads that are so restricted, it is putting extra undue burden on farmers and businesses.

- * **#8:** Burns/Gillis: That County Council endorse the truck study report recommendations as presented by the Truck Study Sub-Committee, including the following:
- a) That given the heavy truck restrictions previously imposed on County Road 7 (Lakeshore Road), that similar restrictions (i.e. restrict heavy trucks excepting local pick-ups and deliveries as defined by Option 3) be placed on the following connecting sections of County Roads:
 - i. County Road 11 (Aberarder Line) from County Road 7 (Lakeshore Road) to County Road 30 (Oil Heritage Road);
 - ii. County Road 12 (Townsend Line) from County Road 7 (Lakeshore Road) to King's Highway 21 (King Street);
 - iii. County Road 26 (Mandaumin Road) from County Road 7 (Lakeshore Road) to King's Highway 402;
 - iv. County Road 30 (Oil Heritage Road) from County Road 7 (Lakeshore Road) to County Road 11 (Aberarder Line).
 - b) County Road 4 (Petrolia Line) - restrict heavy trucks from County Road 26 (Mandaumin Road) to County Road 21 (Oil Heritage Road) excepting local pick-ups and deliveries as defined by Option 1.
 - c) County Road 16 (London Road) - restrict heavy trucks from County Road 33 (Front Street) to County Road 22 (London Line) excepting local pickups and deliveries as defined by Option 1.
 - d) County Road 25 (Confederation Street) - restrict heavy trucks from Ontario Street to Christina Street excepting local pickups and deliveries as defined by Option 1.
 - e) County Road 29 (Indian Road) - restrict heavy trucks from County Road 25 (Confederation Street) to County Road 7 (Lakeshore Road) excepting local pickups and deliveries as defined by Option 1.
 - f) That, in an effort to mitigate the impacts of heavy trucks on those sections of County Roads identified through the study, Staff be directed to work with the various enforcement agencies (i.e. Ontario Provincial Police, Sarnia Police, Ministry of Transportation, etc.).
 - g) That the restrictions be applied to heavy trucks as defined in more detail in the By-Law.
 - h) That exemptions to heavy trucks along restricted routes be permitted as defined in more detail in the By-Law.
 - i) That Staff revise the respective schedules in By-Law 39 of 2009 (A By-Law to Prohibit Heavy Trucks on Certain County Roads) to reflect the above noted restrictions to heavy trucks.
