  - City will add to its duties the winter control maintenance only of Modeland Road (CR 27) from Lakeshore Road (CR 7) to 0.878 km. south of Berger Road (limit between MTO and County).
  - City will be responsible for year-round maintenance of LaSalle Line (CR 35) as outlined in the agreement.

- The balance of the agreement will remain unchanged.
- b) That the revised responsibilities be effective upon the passing of the appropriate amending By-Law by the County and the City of Sarnia.
